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1. ABOUT THE INSTITUTE

PRESPA Institute is an independent analytical centre, think-tank, based in Skopje, North Macedonia, dedicated to the study, research and analysis of international relations and foreign policy, as well as European issues and Europeanization. The Institute strives to promote knowledge about the current situation in North Macedonia and the Western Balkans, as well as to participate in the debate and generation of ideas on these issues at the European level.

The Institute has a young and dynamic team of highly qualified and experienced analysts and a wide network of external collaborators, and relies on the participation of exceptional figures from public life related to international relations and foreign policy, as well as European affairs and Europeanization, economic and business communities, public administration, and the academic, cultural, and social sectors.

The Institute was founded as a citizens' association, by a group of convinced Europeans, and its organizational structure strikes a balance between public and private interests and encourages and fosters the exchange of ideas in an independent environment, providing space for diverse political and social views. The highest governing body of the Institute is the Executive Board, which is composed only of external members, prominent public figures from North Macedonia.

The work of the Institute is carried out through a wide range of publications and reports, public events organized as trainings, courses, seminars, workshops, round tables, etc.

The research of the PRESPA Institute is structured into thematic and geographical blocks.

1. THE NAME

The name of the PRESPA Institute comes from the Prespa Agreement, i.e. **the Final Agreement for the Settlement of Differences, as described in United Nations Security Council Resolutions 817(1993) and 845(1993), terminating the 1995 Interim Agreement and establishing a Strategic Partnership between the Parties**¹, signed on 17 June 2018 in the village of Psarades, Greece; due to the significance that the agreement has for North Macedonia and the policies that the institute will focus on, as well as their impact on our country, the Western Balkans and Europe more broadly.

2. VISION

In-depth research that leads to new ideas for solutions to problems and new policies at the local, national, and regional levels.

3. MISSION

A dynamic group of analysts and researchers conducting in-depth research on international and European issues that influence decision-making processes and activities and contribute to the Europeanization of North Macedonia and the Western Balkans.

4. AIMS AND MEANS

The objectives of the PRESPA Institute are:

- To be an independent research centre, without a partisan agenda, capable of influencing thinking and political action from its local reality;
- To be an independent research centre, capable of influencing thinking and political action through its local reality;
- To be a destination in Skopje, North Macedonia and the Western Balkans for people, institutions and companies working in the relevant field or who are interested in it and to represent a reference point for research, documentation and specialized publications on international relations and foreign policy, European affairs, and Europeanization;
- To be an influential actor in the development of policies and international actions of local authorities, the Government of North Macedonia, and the Western Balkan countries, as well as the European Union;
- To be an organization connected at the regional and European level - with other leading institutes in the relevant field, as well as through its expertise and knowledge to ensure participation in the debate at the European level as a relevant source of knowledge and analysis;
- To participate in international actions and to be a centre for improving knowledge and a source of information on public policies that affect ordinary citizens, thus contributing to democracy, security, stability, freedom, and solidarity throughout the Western Balkans.

PRESPA Institute will achieve its goals through:

- Research, analyse and propose alternative policies and data-based solutions in relevant areas of action, as well as create and manage various databases from conducted research or documentation;

- Assisting in the development of evidence-based public policies and understanding international cooperation, as well as contributing to the creation of an enabling environment for civil society development and networking with other organizations and regional cooperation;
- Organizing and delivering training, courses, seminars, workshops, roundtables, and other forms of instruction, as well as campaigns, promotions, and other forms of action.

5. PROGRAM PRIORITIES

1. To increase understanding and conceptualize how globalization affects North Macedonia's exchange patterns by measuring economic, political, and cultural exchange patterns between different actors, in the context of globalization.
2. To increase understanding and conceptualize the development of the EU accession process through analysis of the real changes and the effect it has on the perception patterns of the citizens of North Macedonia.
3. To strengthen the capacities of civil society and institutions and other stakeholders on issues related to the European Union, public policies and public policy making, as well as advocacy, networking, strategic planning, and organizational development.
4. To contribute to regional cooperation and networking in the Western Balkans, as well as to participate in the debate on the future of Europe and generate ideas at the European level.
5. To facilitate bilateral cooperation between civil societies in North Macedonia and Greece and increase understanding of stereotypes by measuring perception trends, thereby effectively monitoring the implementation of the Prespa Agreement.

The PRESPA Institute will implement the stated program priorities by undertaking the following activities:

1. Measuring the economic, political, and cultural patterns of exchange between different actors, thereby measuring presence as effective positioning, in absolute terms.
2. Determining the amount of presence on the ground and its nature and establishing a solid basis for measuring how much that presence is being used to gain influence.
3. Measuring perception trends and stereotypes in the context of globalization and establishing values of self-perception, external perception, and internal perception.

4. Measuring economic and political changes, as well as functionality in the context of EU accession through quantitative and objective indicators.
5. Determining the relationship between the changes that are taking place and the improvement of people's quality of life.
6. Determining the difference that harmonization will make in terms of legal instruments and implementation, as well as assessing institutional capacity and financing through gap analyses.
7. Measuring perception trends and stereotypes in the context of EU accession and regarding the strength of reforms and their impact on people's lives.
8. Development of tools to support monitoring of the reform process and EU accession and enabling public participation in policy making and accession negotiations.
9. Developing tools and training programs to support skills development and capacity building for Europeanization.

Skopje, 13–14 November 2023. As part of the event, representatives of the Institute moderated three key panels with high-ranking guests, including the OSCE Secretary General, the President of the country and former senior diplomats. The Summit provided the basis for a long-term established cooperation between the think tank community and the OSCE, with the aim of advancing security cooperation in Europe.

Project objectives:

- To establish **an OSCE Expert Network** as an official platform for consultations, dialogue and exchange of views and policies;
- To encourage **the participation of independent think tanks** in shaping priorities and scenarios for security cooperation in Europe;
- To initiate a process of **programming, networking and consensus** building among researchers and policy makers from OSCE participating States;
- To ensure visibility and continuity in **the participation of North Macedonia** as the chairing country and bearer of the OSCE Network Support Initiative;
- To produce **recommendations and conclusions** submitted to the OSCE Ministerial Council and to develop **a policy document** with analyses and scenarios for European security.

9. ABOUT THE ORGANIZATION

PPRESPA Institute has a two-tier governance structure consisting of the Assembly of the organization and the Board of Directors.

According to Article 22 of the Law on Citizens' Associations and Foundations, and according to the Statute of the PRESPA Institute, the Assembly is composed of all members of the organization. The Assembly, within its competence, has the authority to adopt the statute, work program and other acts, elect bodies of the association, propose amendments and supplements to the Statute and Program of the institute, adopt the annual work report and financial report (final account), admit new members, status changes, elect the president of the organization and the Board of Directors, etc.

The Board of Directors consists of 5 members, including the President of the Board, elected for a term of 3 years. The Board of Directors prepares the sessions of the Assembly, adopts the guidelines and the annual work plan, the annual financial plan, appoints the Executive Director, etc.

1. BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Lura POLOZHANI is the President of the Executive Board of the PRESPA Institute. She holds a BA in International Relations from Malmö University, Sweden, and a Master of Science in European Studies: Ideas and Identities from the London School of Economics. In 2022, she defended her PhD in Law and Politics from the University of Graz, Austria.

Dr. Lura Polozhani is a researcher on the H2020 Connekt project at the University of Graz, which investigates the contexts of violent extremism and radicalization in the Balkans and the MENA region. Her other research interests include civic practices in divided societies, social movements, and democratization.

Lura previously worked as an advisor to the Prime Minister of North Macedonia on cooperation with international organizations. She continued to work for UNHCR as an external expert, and worked as a researcher at the University of Pristina, a university assistant at CSEES in Graz and a project manager for ECMI Kosovo.

Lura is a member of the Executive Board for the term 2023-2026.

Zoran ILIEVSKI is a member of the Board of Directors of the PRESPA Institute. He graduated in political science from the Justinian I Faculty of Law at the University of Ss. Cyril and Methodius, received a master's degree in European integration and regionalism from the University of Graz, Austria, and a doctorate in political science from the University of Ss. Cyril and Methodius in Skopje. During

his studies, he was twice declared a student of the generation, for which he was awarded.

Dr. Zoran Ilievski is a full professor of political science at the Justinian I Faculty of Law and head of the Southeast Europe Office of the Global Council for Tolerance and Peace, an international organization based in Malta.

As a researcher and leader of international research projects, he has published over forty papers and two monographs, related to international relations, European integration, democratic consolidation, applied politics and especially the regulation of ethnic conflicts. He is a recipient of the European Order of Saint George of Habsburg-Lorraine.

Ilievski is the head of the Centre for Political Science Research and Analysis at the Faculty of Law "Justinianus Primus", president of East-West Bridge in Skopje and a member of the presidency of East-West Bridge International, based in Belgrade, Serbia. He is an honorary member of the South East European Group of the Trilateral Commission (New York-Paris-Tokyo), and from 2009 to 2017, he was an advisor to the President of the Republic of Macedonia, coordinator of the Council for Foreign Relations of the President of the Republic of Macedonia and program coordinator of the President's School of Young Leaders.

Professor Ilievski is a member of the Board of Directors for the term 2023-2026.

Martin GALEVSKI is a member of the Board of Directors of the PRESPA Institute. He completed his master's degree in education at the University of Cambridge and his doctoral studies at the University of Oxford, United Kingdom.

Martin has been working as a researcher and expert in the field of education and human capital development for more than ten years. He closely cooperates with several international organizations in the field, including the World Bank, Westminster Foundation for Democracy, UNDP, UNESCO, and others. He is the author of about twenty scientific studies focusing on education and socio-political participation among young people. As a leading expert, Martin has worked on the preparation of several strategic documents in the country, including the National Youth Strategy 2023-2027 and the Human Capital Strategy (2022-2030).
